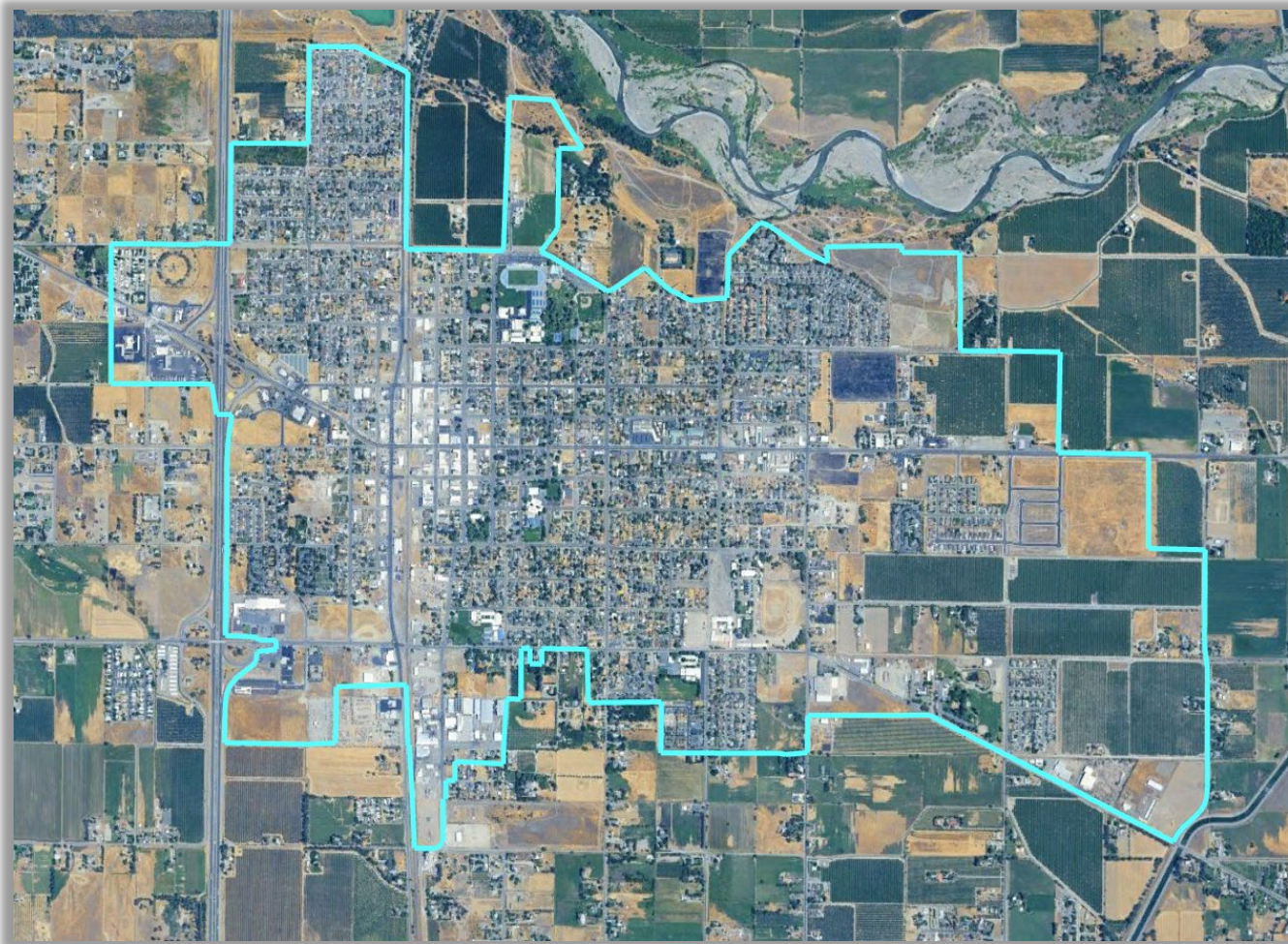

First Hearing on Draft Maps

April 7, 2026

Districting Process

Step	Description
Adopt Resolution December 2, 2025	Approve resolution of intention within 45 days of demand letter.
Two Initial Hearings March 3 & March 17	Held prior to release of draft maps. Education and to solicit input on the composition of districts.
1st Hearing on Draft Maps April 7	Hearing to discuss and revise the draft maps and to discuss the election sequence.
Submit draft maps April 10	Deadline for residents to submit draft maps for Council consideration at the April 7 hearing.
Post draft maps online April 14	Maps must be posted at least 7 days prior to consideration at a Council hearing.
2nd hearing on draft maps April 21	Additional hearing to discuss and revise the draft maps and to discuss the election sequence.
Map Selection May 5	Map and election sequence selected. Final map must be posted at least 7 days prior to adoption.

Districting Rules and Goals

1. Federal Laws

Equal Population
Federal Voting Rights Act
No Racial Gerrymandering



2. California Criteria

In prioritized order:

1. **Geographically contiguous**
2. **Avoid division of neighborhoods and “communities of interest”**
(Socio-economic geographic areas that should be kept together)
3. **Easily identifiable boundaries**
4. **Compact**
(Do not bypass one group of people to get to a more distant group of people)

2. California Prohibition

“Shall not adopt election district boundaries for the purpose of favoring or discriminating against an incumbent, political candidate, or political party.”

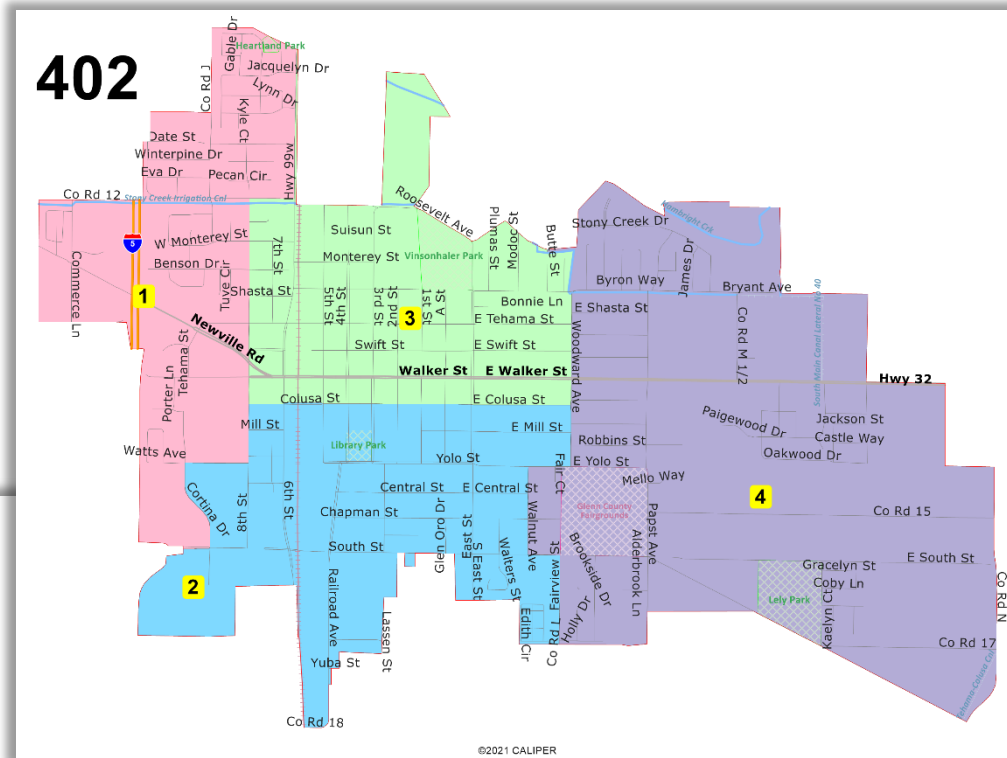
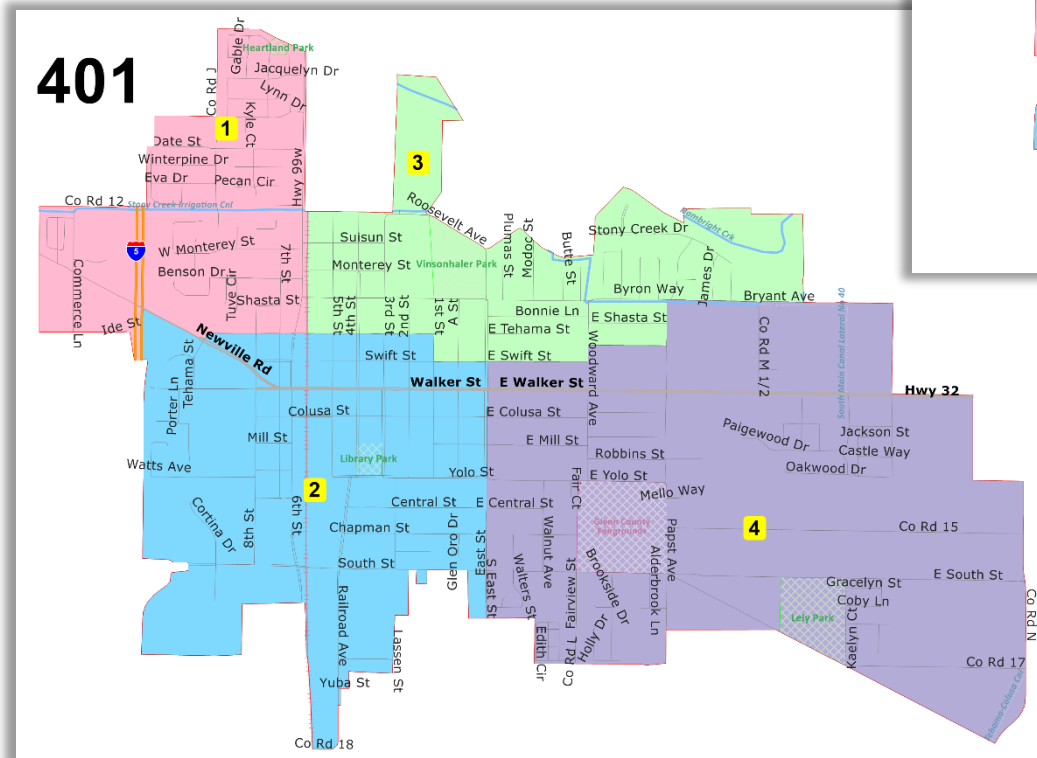

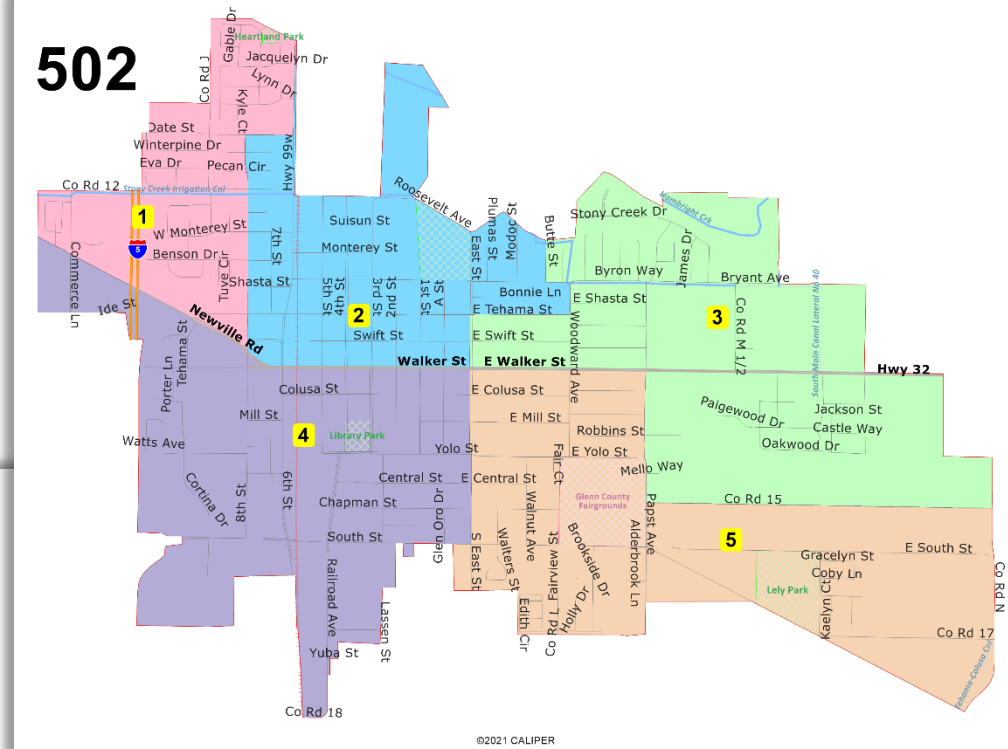
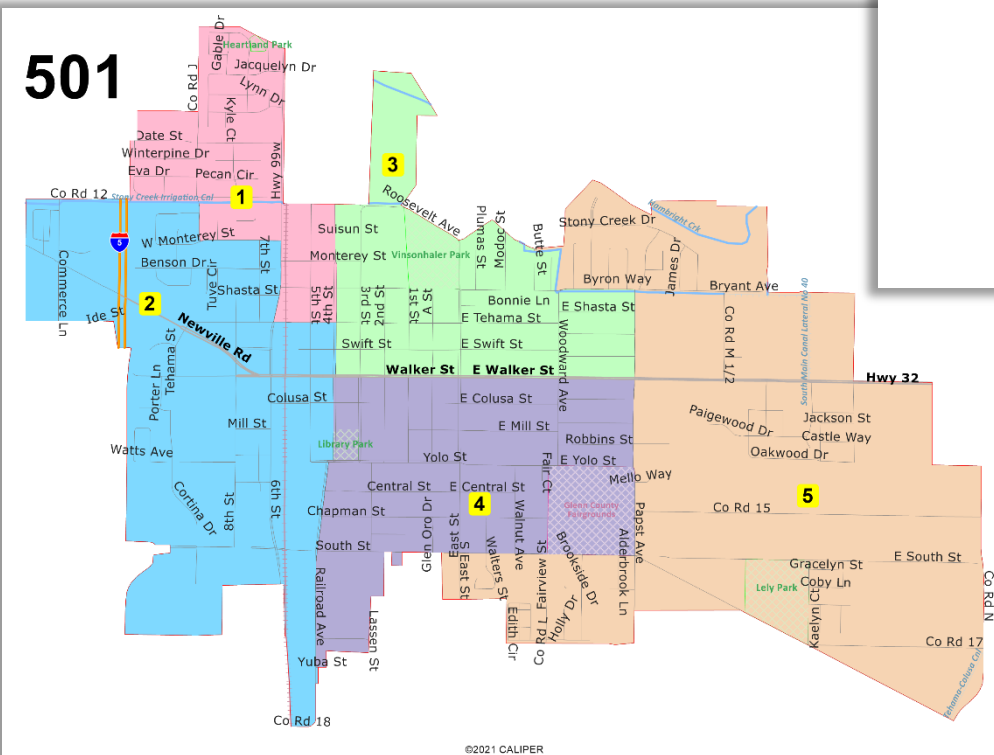
Both maps are population balanced, comply with the FAIR MAPS Act, and have a majority-Latino District 1 (by CVAP).

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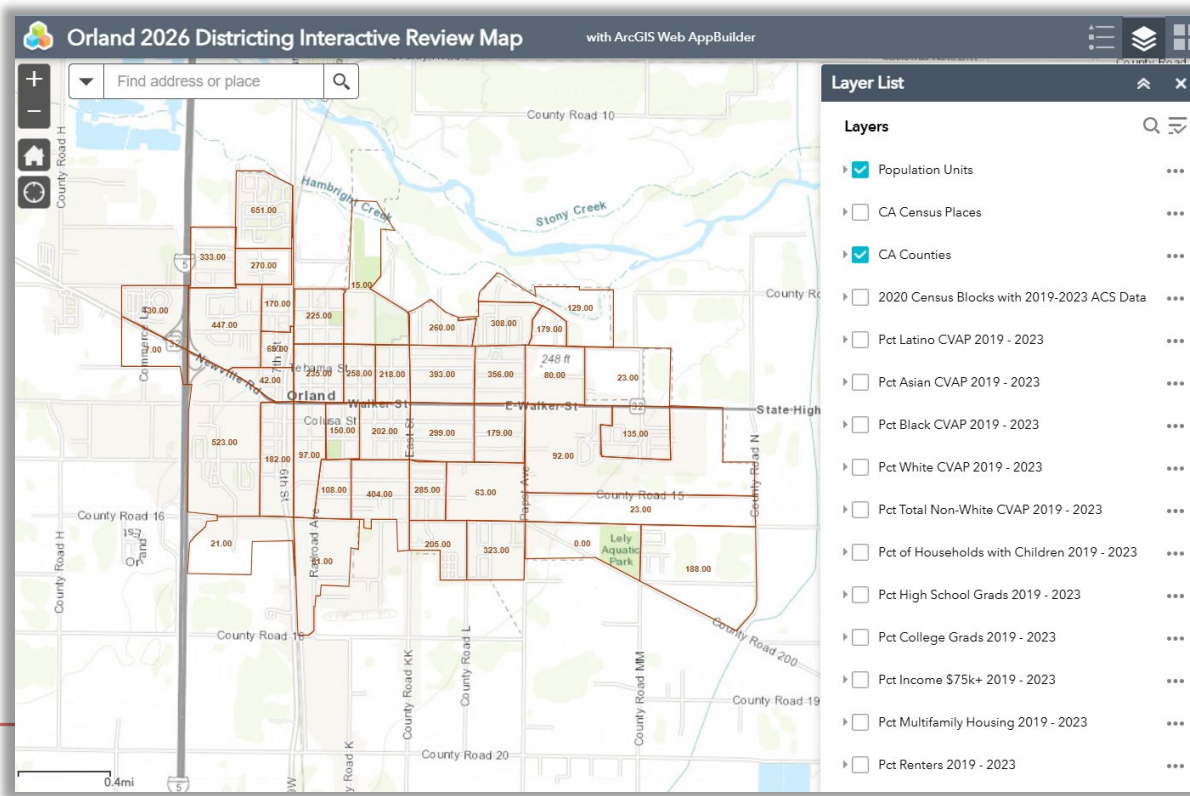
Both maps are population balanced, comply with the FAIR MAPS Act, and have a majority-Latino District 1 (by CVAP).

Simple Map Review Tool

Online Interactive Review Map

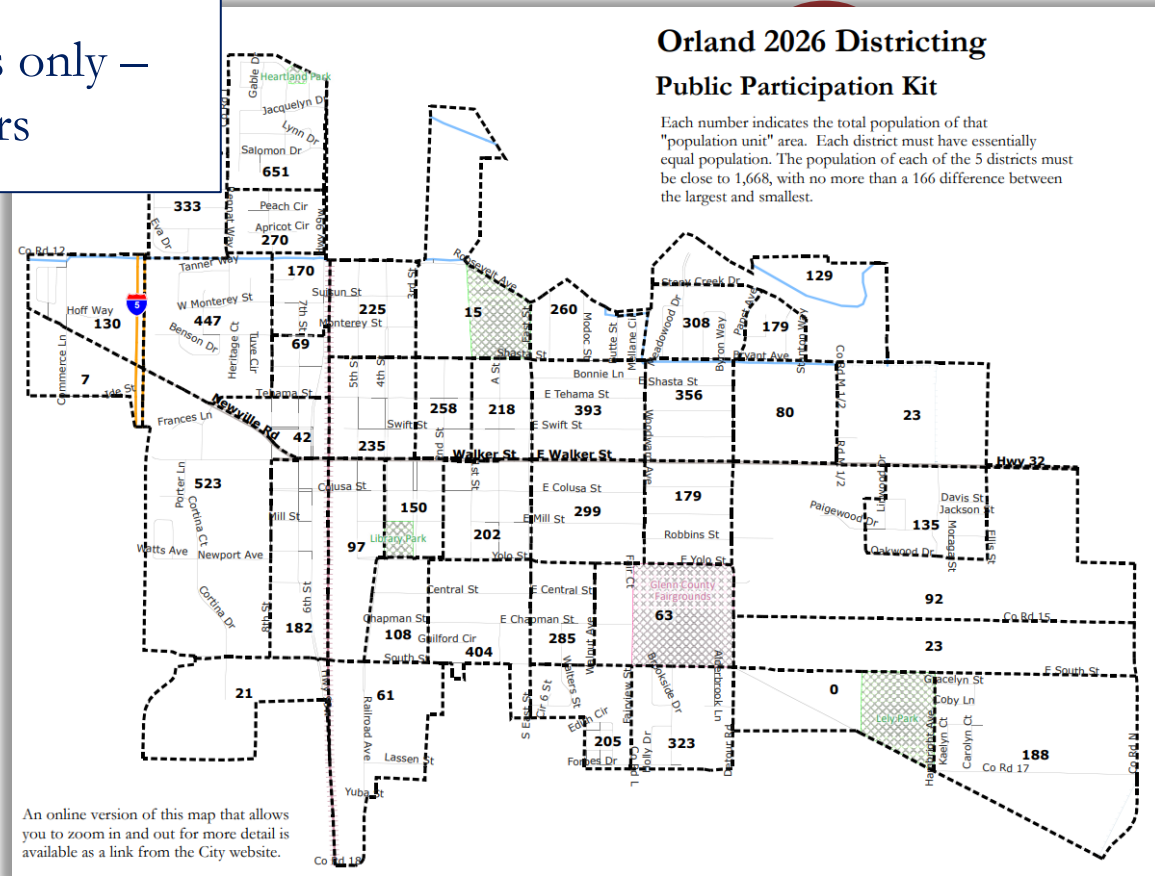
- ESRI's “ArcGIS Online” – similar to Google Maps in ease of use
- Used to review, analyze and compare maps, not to create them
- Includes overlays of “community of interest” and other data



Simple Map Drawing Tool

Paper “Public Participation Kit”

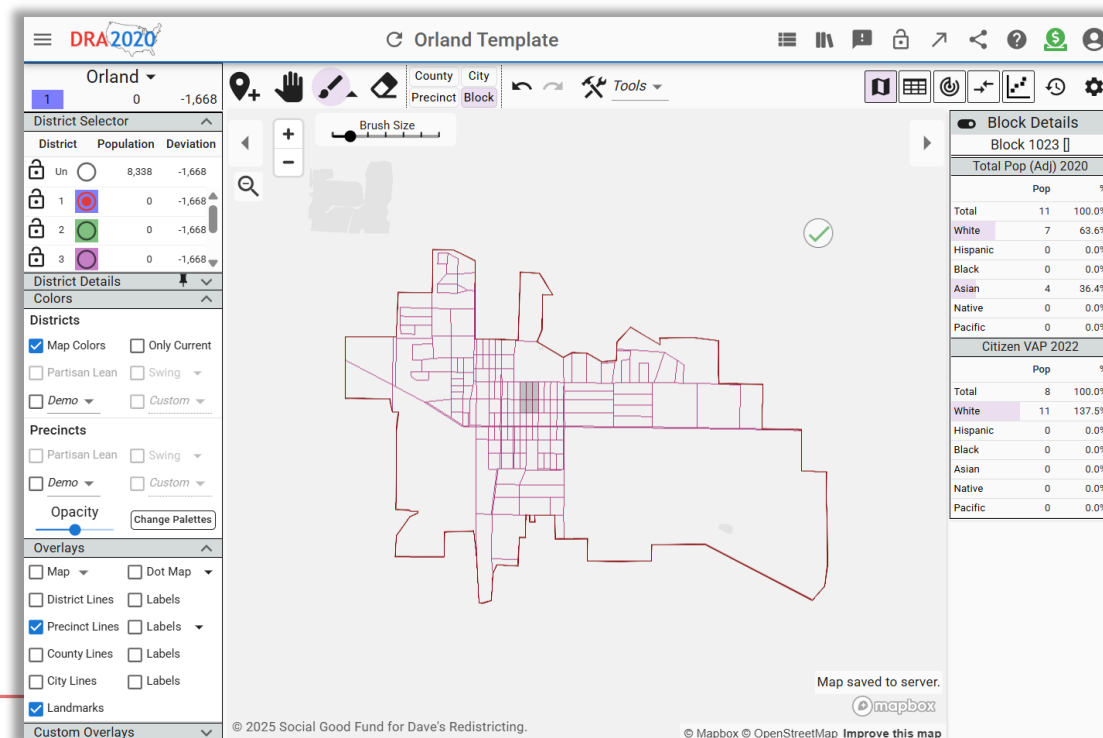
- For those without internet access or who prefer paper
- Total Population Counts only – no demographic numbers



Online Map Drawing Tool

Simple “paintbrush & eraser” tool. A 4-minute “how-to” video is on the website.

- Full demographic data available
- Create, collaborate and share your map
- Remember: you must send in the link to your map when you finish or the City has no way to know you drew a map.
